# Bible Study—Fall 2012 The Crucial Points of the Truth in Galatians (2)

### The Revelation of God's Son in Us

- Gal. 1:15-16 But when it pleased God, who set me apart from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, to reveal His Son in me that I might announce Him as the gospel among the Gentiles, immediately I did not confer with flesh and blood.
- **John 17:3** And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Him whom You have sent, Jesus Christ.
- John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that everyone who believes into Him would not perish, but would have eternal life.
- **2 Cor. 3:16** But whenever their heart turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.
- John 14:6 Jesus said to him, I am the way and the reality and the life; no one comes to the Father except through Me.

## I. The desire of God's heart is to reveal His Son in us that we may know Him, receive Him as our life, and become the sons of God—John 17:3; 3:16; 1:12; Gal. 4:5-6:

- A. The heart of God is fully occupied with the living Person of His Son—Gal. 1:15-16:
  - 1. The Son of God, as the embodiment and expression of God the Father, is life to us—John 1:18; 14:9-11; Heb. 1:3:
  - 2. For our experience and enjoyment, the living Person is the all-inclusive Spirit with the divine reality—John 1:14; 14:6.
  - 3. This One is life the uncreated, eternal life of God Who is versus religion formed by man in dead letter with vain traditions.
- B. Because of man's fall, we are easily distracted to care for other things in place of Christ. Man has a natural tendency to direct his attention to religion with its tradition.
  - 1. If we would receive the revelation of the Son of God, we need to drop our concepts; every concept, whether spiritual or carnal, is a veil.
    - a. These veils can frustrate us from knowing Christ.
    - b. It is important for us to pray, "Lord, help me to drop everything that is a veil."
  - 2. Whenever the heart turns to the Lord, the veil will be taken away—2 Cor. 3:16:
    - a. Our turned-away heart is the veil. To turn our heart to the Lord is to take away the veil.
    - b. When the veils are removed, we will be under the shining of the heavenly light and we will receive the revelation of the living Person.
